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## Britain's Barbaric Bombarded on Black Saturday

At approximately 6pm last night, an event of horror beyond belief began for the terrified inhabitants of London as they were hit by the worst night of bombing since the war began during which thousands perished including innocent women and young children.

Yesterday life in our capital city began like many other days living through the war, with locals going about their everyday lives; travelling to work, school, the shops... However, upon the arrival of early evening things were to change quite dramatically for many in a very short space of time. At approximately, 6pm Londoners everywhere heard the familiar wail of the siren, raising alarm in many and hailing most into the appropriate shelters for safety.

Within moments, the horrendous groan of German bombers (The Luftwaffe) could be heard and the catastrophic and continuous bombing began. During only the first hour of this devastating air raid, the rain of bombs had obliterated essential factories, busy ports and destroyed citizens' homes. Many were blown down; irreparable. Vicious fires, choking smoke and destructive dust made it almost impossible to see, with many buildings toppled precariously ready to fall and gas mains in the streets creating yet more fire. Frantically, fire engines, with hoses were everywhere trying faultlessly to do what they could to dampen the effects of such devastation however all across the city; the demoralising reality was plain to see.

"This is the worst night of bombing we've seen so far," reported one exhausted fire officer. "The scenes we have seen tonight, will haunt me for an eternity. I only wish I could have saved more souls!"

Another devastated local woman, Agnes Green told me that like many others, the sound of the siren came as a common occurrence and she and her family had hesitated to retreat to their shelter believing that it was another false alarm. However thankfully they frantically fled to their Anderson shelter upon hearing the precarious wail, just in time to witness their house blown to a pile of smouldering bricks.

The ministry of Defence has today revealed that they believe this is the first of many air raids planned by the Germans, under the reign of Adolf Hitler, to debilitate our nation and cause mass casualties, forcing our hand to surrender. However, if what has been witnessed today shows anything, of the determination and dedication of our emergency services and local community, I believe their plans have already floundered.
