William Shakespeare is the most famous writer in history. His plays are still published, read and performed all over the world. His words and phrases are used by ordinary people every day. His ideas about greed, hate, power, love, death and many other things still influence the way we think.

Yet Shakespeare lived and worked 400 years ago, during the reigns of Elizabeth I and James I. Although his plays give a vivid picture of this period, little is known about the sort of man he was, or about his private life. The only evidence, apart from the plays and poems, comes from official documents, such as church registers, tax records and wills. From these we can build up a picture of his life and times.
