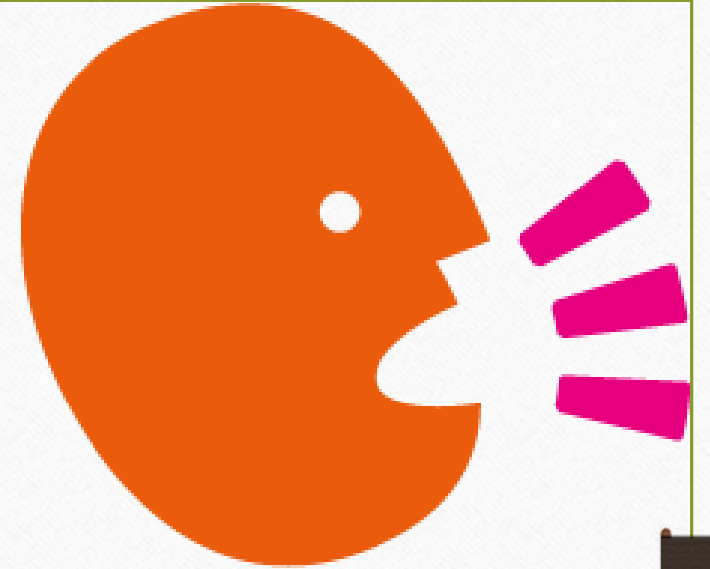

Direct Speech

Direct speech reports what someone has said or written by quoting their exact words in speech marks/inverted commas/quotation marks.



"I couldn't believe the destruction created in such a short time! Fires everywhere, screaming and shouting and chaos..."

REPORTED SPEECH

Reported speech reports what someone has said or written but not in exactly the same words.

Mr Rogers, the local milkman, reported that he had still been able to deliver the morning ration but it was very difficult as the sights he saw took his breath away.
