They were practising the a,b,c,d check for the first time



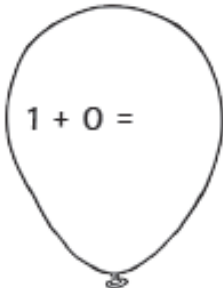
